We also refinished the back wall of the bar and as our ice machine needed more repairs we put in a small freezer and will use the upstairs ice machine to make ice and put it in the freezer, this should also cut down on our electrical use.

The Ladies Auxiliary has continue the bag lunches program which gives them needed income. This fiscal year, the Auxiliary has donated \$29.000 to the branch.

The Wednesday night darts are up and running again all though the numbers are down. Pool players are in Friday afternoon. I believe that it will take a concentrated effort to get our workers back as many have found other interests and after two years they have moved on. Many who were very reluctant to return due to covid are now returning so hopefully this will encourage others and my concerns will be lessened.

Membership

Branch # 192 has seen a drop in membership renewals for this past year due to COVID-19. Previous year we had 371 members in good standing compared to 330 currently at this time. We have had 9 new memberships, 0 transfers out and 5 transfers in. We have also had 10 online enrolments; however, we have had a lot of people say that they are having trouble trying to renew their memberships online. Our Membership Chairman has been in touch with Command to coordinate. We have just started to reopen these last few weeks and will monitor this closely as this should definitely help with our renewals.

Poppy

Our 2021 Poppy Campaign went well; however, we have seen a drop in the amount of income made. This was largely due to the restrictions placed on us due to Covid and not being able to have volunteers stand in the many venues around town to promote our Campaign.

Veterans Service

Our Veterans Service officer has seen an average of 2 Veterans per month to help and assist with VAC services since the last report.

Finance

The Branch finances are doing very well all things considered. Our Catch the Ace online lottery partnered with the Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital Foundation is doing extremely well. We are in Week 30 and the Jackpot is over \$114,000.00! We have also applied for the third Small Business Grant and are waiting payment for that. However, on 20th December our Branch had a major flood in the basement. We have been dealing with insurance and all is going well as can be. The problem found was the main sewer pipe that connects to the Town has rotted out. We are now fixing the problem before we go forward with our renovations. The cost for this repair will be approximately \$25-30,000.00! Thank goodness that our Catch the Ace lottery is doing so well as this will help pay for these repairs.

Ways and Means

We are starting to plan events as the restrictions from the Public Health Unit are opening up. We are having our St Patty's Day party and looking at planning more events in the Spring. As well, our rental hall bookings are picking up for the Spring into the Summer. This should bring in some good income.

Ladies Auxiliary

The Ladies Auxiliary have been pretty quiet due to COVID 19 over the last few months. However, they are starting to get catering functions and Celebrations of Life as the restrictions are lifted. We have quite a few Celebrations of Life booked and this will definitely help them with their income.

Constitution and Bylaws

Nothing to Report.

Sports

As we see the restrictions with regard to Covid from the Public Health Unit decreasing, we are noticing more people coming out to play darts. A new Drop-In Dart League has started up on Monday nights and continues to do very well with attendance. We have also restarted our Ladies Auxiliary Dart League and Men's drop-in Darts on Tuesdays, a Branch Singles Dart League on Wednesdays and the Branch Mixed Dart League on Thursdays, and all are following the COVID protocols with regard to playing Darts. This definitely helps with our Bar sales and overall income for the Branch.

Overall

We have been pretty busy dealing with problems and repairs for our building that is over 50 years old since the last report period. We are just starting to re-open our Branch to the public while following all COVID protocols; however, the basement remains closed and will be for some time to come. We are thankful to still be able to use the upstairs main hall and lounge. We keep monitoring our finances on a weekly basis. We are very flexible to adjust to the current situation as it changes.

Our Branch income has been somewhat challenged as we adjust to the ever-changing pandemic restrictions. We are fortunate, however, to own our building and do not have rent or mortgage payments; however, the building and some of the equipment is well over 30 years old and we have had to repair or replace some. The steady rent income we receive from a building at the rear of our parking lot, our many volunteers, the initiatives taken by the Branch Ways and Means Committee and the Ladies Auxiliary's overwhelmingly successful takeout events, plus, our very successful and ongoing bottle collection, which exceeds \$18,000, have more than covered these expenses.

We have also applied for, and received, Federal and Provincial grants that have helped, and, in addition, we have received personal and corporate donations for which we are very grateful. We are now financially fit to see our way through this coming year.

Our Poppy Campaign was somewhat curtailed due to canvassing restrictions; however, our volunteers persisted and the community generously responded. We continue to provide Veteran support through the Poppy Trust Fund and our Lottery Trust Fund.

Our monthly column in the Kanata Community Voice newspaper has proven to be overwhelmingly successful in keeping the awareness of our status and fundraising activities in the minds of our community every month throughout this Pandemic with distribution in the mailboxes of over 37,000 residents and businesses in Kanata.

At this time our total membership is 304. In addition to membership renewals, we have had a number of new members join us during the pandemic and we are looking forward to their participation. By the start of our 2022/23 term on 01 June, we expect to have well over 300 members.

Our regular branch Election would have normally been at our General Meeting in April, 2021 however up until recently, all Branch Elections were suspended. We are pleased, however, to be able to now hold our regular meeting schedule with our first General meeting on 16 March and our General/Election meeting on 20 April, 2022. At our Branch we are all volunteers and when you have volunteers you have success.
